**Sign up for and use the AAUW Discussion Boards, <http://discuss.aauw.org>.**

While those systems may be reorganized or otherwise changed in the next few months, they are, at the moment, the one official “public” place for members to post messages to each other.

**Check out <http://wiki.bbv.org>**

and consider taking ownership of a section that matches your passion. What do you think is missing from [www.aauw.org](http://www.aauw.org)? Can you fill that hole?

**Start a blog or encourage your “prime communicator” to start one,**

and let the rest of us know about it (through the e-mail list, the discussion board, or the wiki). If you regularly share information on a specific AAUW topic with the members of your branch, consider opening it up to the world. There are already AAUW blogs at [blogger.com](http://blogger.com), [myspace.com](http://myspace.com), and [facebook.com](http://facebook.com).

**Learn about RSS**

Feeling overwhelmed by information? RSS tools help you structure all that info, get it out of your e-mail into a personal “e-newspaper.” The new [aauw.org](http://aauw.org) site will provide RSS feeds. Check out how your state/branch website can republish them.
